401(k) Plan Checklist

This checklist is *not* a complete description of all plan requirements, and should *not* be used as a substitute for a complete plan review.

Every year it is important that you review the requirements for operating your 401(k) retirement plan. Use this checklist to help you keep your plan in compliance with many of the important rules. 1. Has your plan document been updated within the past few years? If your plan has not been updated to reflect recent law changes, the plan needs to be revised. (More)	No	6. By supplying your tax advisor with information regarding all employees who receive a Form W-2, you may reduce the risk of omitting eligible employees.
2. Are the plan's operations based on the terms of the plan document? Failure to follow the terms of the plan is a common problem encountered on audit. (More)	No	7. 3. Is the plan's definition of compensation for all deferrals and allocations used correctly?	No	may result in additional taxes and penalties to the participant and employer. (More)
Because your plan may use different definitions of compensation for different purposes, it's important that you apply the proper definition according to your plan document. (More)		8. Have you timely deposited employee elective deferrals? You should deposit deferrals as soon as they can be segregated from the employer's assets. (More)

If you answered "No" to any of the above questions, you may have made a mistake in the operation of your 401(k) plan. This list is only a guide to a more compliant plan, so answering "Yes" to each question may not mean your plan is 100% compliant. Many mistakes can be corrected easily, without penalty and without notifying the IRS.
